Australia is the world's smallest continent. Its size is 7.7 million square kilometers. Australia is nearly as large as Europe but only about 18 million people live there. 99 % of the Australian population is a mix of European and Asian. Since the nineteenth century, millions of people have emigrated to Australia from other countries. Although Aborigines have lived in Australia for over 40,000 years, only 1% of the population today is Aboriginal. After the first European settlers arrived in the 18th century, many Aborigines died of disease and hunger.

Central Australia is called "the Outback". It is a huge area of desert, small trees and bushes, where very few people live. In the centre of the Outback is Ayers Rock, a mysterious giant red sandstone rock. It is 348 metres high and is thought to be the highest single rock in the world. It has been a sacred place for Aborigines for at least 10,000 years.

The Great Barrier Reef, off the east coast of Australia, is one of the wonders of the natural world – it is the world's largest coral reef ecosystem. The ideal environment for coral is shallow, salty and warm water and a lot of light. There are different types of coral: some grow slowly and live to be hundreds of years old and other grow fast and live shorter. Only live coral is coloured. Dead coral is white. The Great Barrier Reef is full of wildlife, including dolphins and whales, green turtles, more than 1500 species of fish, shellfish and crabs. The reefs are now protected and tourists can only see the parts which are under protection.

Australia is separate from other continents and has its own unique species of wildlife. These include 'marsupials' – the kangaroo and koala bear – which keep their young in a pouch. In northern, tropical territories, you can also find crocodiles and alligators.
