Other players, like Lionel Messi from the Argentine team, told the journalist that it was impossible to talk to or hear other players from his team.

It is quite obvious that the spectators in the stadiums, players, journalists, even people in front of TV were annoyed by the sound of these instruments. The only happy people were those who had produced and sold the vuvuzelas – they made a lot of money!
