Temperatures can reach 57°C in Death Valley. The valley is one of the hottest places on earth and a very popular place to take a holiday. It's located in Eastern California. It holds many records. This is the lowest point in the Western Hemisphere, 100 metres below sea level.

The average temperature is around 40°C and the ground can reach 115°C in the summer. The average rainfall isn't even 2 centimetres a year.

Gold, silver, copper and lead can be found in the valley. In the 19th century lots of people came there to look for gold. With each discovery of precious metal, a new town was born. But the good times didn't last. Tourists can watch ghost towns, which are the remains of lively towns built between 1849 and 1900.

Visitors coming to Death Valley National Park must have a car or other vehicle and a good water supply, at least 4 litres per day. Dry and hot desert air gives deceiving images of distance. For example, a mountain looks as if it's only a few hundreds metres away, while in reality, it can be ten miles away.

Rattlesnakes are very dangerous for people. They can hide behind rocks or in holes. Coyotes are even more dangerous, especially around campsites.

There's a Visitor's Centre, which helps tourists plan their visit and sells good maps. Visitors should always inform park rangers about their plans, giving departure time, destination and expected time of return. If they have problems with their car, they shouldn't go off looking for help. Help will come by wardens patrolling the area.
