

I. READING

The first meal of the day is breakfast – usually between 7 and 8 o'clock. The traditional British breakfast is very big: bacon and eggs, sausages, tomatoes, mushrooms, baked beans and toast! But nowadays people don't usually cook a big breakfast every morning. They only have a cooked breakfast on Sundays, or when they stay in a hotel. Most people have light breakfast. These are some typical things that people have for breakfast: toast with jam or honey, cereal with milk and sugar, fruit, yoghurt, orange juice and coffee or tea.

Between 12 and 2 o'clock people have lunch. This is often a light meal of soup, sandwiches or salad. Sometimes people can have fish and chips in a pub. Most children have their lunch at school. They can take sandwiches from home (a packed lunch) or they can buy food at the school canteen.

The main meal of the day is dinner. People usually eat this between 6 and 7 o'clock in the evening. A traditional dinner is meat or fish with potatoes and vegetables, but many people nowadays cook foreign food. Lasagne, risotto or curry are popular and some people are vegetarians. After the main course, some people have dessert (also called pudding) – such as fruit, chocolate cake, or apple pie with ice-cream or custard.

Some families have afternoon tea at about 5 o'clock. This is a light meal of black tea with milk and sugar, sandwiches with fish paste, smoked salmon or ham with sliced cucumbers. Instead of sandwiches you can have cakes or scones with butter for afternoon tea.

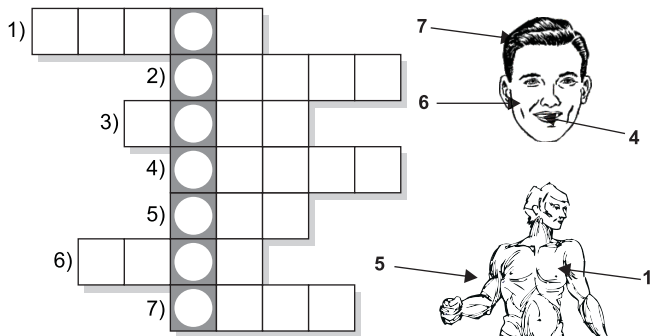
