- Ayers Rock is in the Outback. It is a mysterious giant red rock. Ayers Rock is sacred to the Aboriginal people. The rock is famous for its colour changes. It is dark red at sunrise and sunset, and black after rain.

- Kakadu National park is near Darwin in the north, tropical part of Australia. It has beautiful scenery and natural galleries of Aboriginal rock art. Some of their paintings are over 20 thousand years old. Aborigines are black native people of Australia. They lived in Australia before the first Europeans arrived. Now only about 200 thousand Aborigines live there.

- Australia is home to many unusual animals including the koala bear and the kangaroo. Koalas live in the mountains. Red kangaroos live in the deserts. They can jump 12 metres in one hop. Only in Australia you can see platypuses and emus.

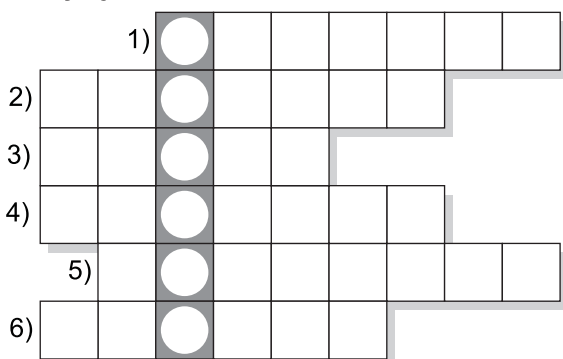
