Who hasn't heard of the Loch Ness Monster? Most of us have. But who has seen this legendary creature? For a long time people believed that the lucky person was a doctor, Robert Wilson, who took a famous picture of something that could be a tail of a big animal. Scientists are now sure that the photograph was a trick. Still, many tourists travel and hope to see the monster living in Loch Ness, a lake in Scotland. They call it Nessie, a nice name for a frightening creature.

If you go to Tokyo, you'll definitely visit another monster, a lizard-like Godzilla. The Japanese invented their King of Monsters and it appeared in 28 films and many comic books and video games. It has changed its looks and the way it behaves. Godzilla is a symbol of the atomic bombs of World War II. Yet, many people when you say Japan will think of Honda, Toyota, Mazda and ... Godzilla.

The Czechs gave life to their own monster. The famous Golem of Prague was created in the 16th century by Rabbi Loew to protect Jewish people from harm. It was just a figure but Rabbi Loew brought it to life with special words. Then, it grew bigger and bigger and became very dangerous so Rabbi Loew changed the monster into a figure again. People say that Golem is now in the Old-New Synagogue of Prague. They say it may come back to life again.

The castle in Bran in Romania has about 450 thousand visitors every year because they believe the legendary Count Dracula lived there. Vlad Dracula, a real person and a very cruel prince who lived in the 15th century, probably spent only a few days in this castle. In the 19th century, Bram Stoker, wrote a book about an imaginary vampire called Dracula. Since that time, Dracula has appeared in many stories and many films.

Our Polish monster is a dragon which lives in a cave near the Castle of Wawel. Although it has a bad reputation for eating beautiful ladies, Poles quite like him. Every five minutes the modern dragon produces real fire. If you can't wait for five minutes, you can send an SMS to the dragon and it will make fire especially for you.
