Britain is a fantastic place for the seaside holiday. A United Kingdom has got thousands of beaches. People can sunbathe, swim, go surfing or walk around the coast on special paths, like the Pembrokeshire Coast Path in Wales. It's 299 kilometres long and goes around the dramatic Pembrokeshire peninsula. It was opened to the public in 1970. The coast path is one of the best areas in the UK for watching sea birds, which live here for most of the year, and there are wild flowers, historical ruins, Norman castles and beautiful old churches.

Walkers sometimes can watch seals and dolphins swimming offshore.

The path begins on the north coast, where there is a twelfth-century church, and climbs up to Cemaes Head along some of the highest cliffs in Britain. It goes past several nature reserves, two or three towns and some really beautiful countryside, before it finishes at Amroth on the south coast.

Tourists can get to the path by car or bus but after that they have to walk. The path can be quite difficult, so the walkers need to be fit. For the whole path they need at least twelve days.

Along the path there are small hotels and family-run guest houses, where the tourists can sleep. There are enough shops and backpackers can stay at campsites along the way.
