Only a few hundred years ago, the only people to live in New York were Native Americans - the Algonquian Indians. They lived in a forest on an island which they called Mannahatta.

In 1609 an Englishman, Henry Hudson, discovered the Hudson River. In 1626 a Dutchman called Peter Minuit bought Mannahatta island from the Indians for 24 dollars - today the island is called Manhattan. The Dutch built a town and called it New Amsterdam. In 1664 the English took the town and changed the name to New York after the English town of York.

The most famous place in New York is the Statue of Liberty. It's in New York harbour.

The statue was a present from France to the people of the USA. It's over a hundred years old - it arrived by ship in 1885. The statue is 93 metres high. It is made from 32 tonnes of copper.

New York is famous for enormous skyscrapers situated in Manhattan.

The Empire state Building opened in 1931 and for 42 years it was the tallest building in the world. The twin towers of the World Trade Center, which opened in 1973, were taller than the Empire State Building. But terrorists destroyed the World Trade Center on 11th September 2001. The Empire State Building is 381 metres high and has 102 floors. It's taller than the Eiffel Tower (319 metres) and the Great Pyramid of Egypt.

The Chrysler Building is also famous. It opened in 1930 and it was the tallest building in the world for a year. It has 77 floors and is 320 metres high.

The Willis Tower is the highest building in the western hemisphere. It is in Chicago and opened in 1973. It's nearly 450 metres tall and has 110 floors. But the highest of all is the Khalifa Tower, situated in Dubai, the United Arab Emirates. It is 828 metres tall and has 160 floors. It opened on 4th January 2010.

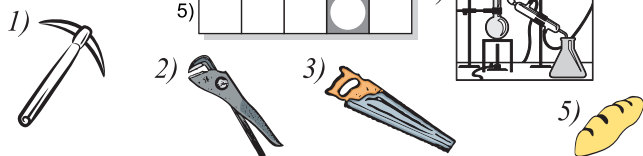
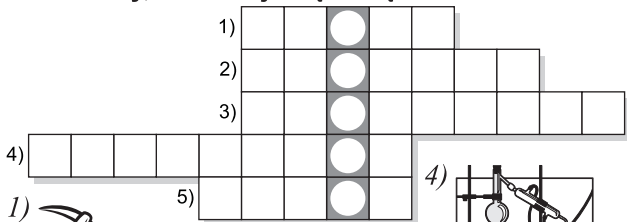
