*Captain James Cook was a restless traveller and explorer. He was born in 1728. As a teenager he started to work as a sailor on merchant ships. Then he joined the Royal Navy at the age of twenty-seven.*

*He was famous for his Pacific voyages. He set out on his first voyage round the world in 1768. In 1770 he arrived in Australia. He and his crew were the first British to visit it. The first European who reached Australia was a Dutch explorer, Abel Tasman, in 1642.*

*Cook's small ship, the Endeavour, left England with 94 people aboard. They included officers, crew and scientists. Among the scientists on Cook's ship were botanists. They found so many new plants where they landed in Australia that they called it Botany Bay. They were the first white people who had contacts with Aborigines. James Cook took the eastern coast of Australia for Britain, but at that time he didn't know just how big Australia was. In 1772 he set out on his second voyage on board of Resolution. He discovered many Pacific islands. His third voyage around the world started in 1776. Then he discovered Hawaii Islands. He died in Hawaii in a fight with Hawaiians in 1779.*

*James Cook gave the name Sandwich Islands for Hawaii to honour the Earl of Sandwich. Another example of Cook's lack of imagination are the Society Islands, which owe their name to the Royal Society in London. One of the Society Islands is Tahiti, which was visited by Cook a few times.*

*Tahiti is famous for its wonderful scenery and beauty of its gentle inhabitants. The island was the residence of such famous people as Paul Gauguin and Louis Stevenson. Tahiti inspired Stevenson to write "Treasure Island" - a book which is now known all over the world.*

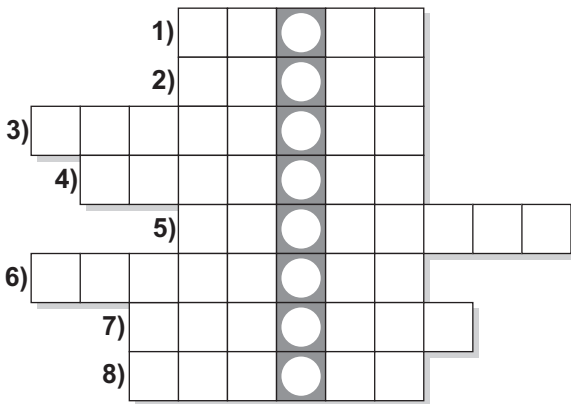
